New Library Director Already at Home

Barbara Zink Berkey will be stepping into a new but familiar role as she takes the helm as the new director of the Lowell Public Library.

Berkey comes well equipped for her new position, having served the library for 24 years in positions of Assistant Director, Children's Librarian, Reference Librarian, Literacy Coordinator, Cataloger, Local History/Genealogy Librarian, and most recently, Interim Director.


"I am looking forward to this phase of my library career. Keeping up with the pace of ever-changing technology is the challenge of libraries today and I want to see our library stay on equal footing. We're very proud of the local historical data on our website that continues to draw questions from all over the country and beyond. Since genealogy has always been of special interest to me, enhancing our genealogy capabilities with other on-line resources is one of my goals."

"Offering excellent service to our patrons is of prime importance. We have a multi-talented staff at the main library and its Schneider and Shelby branches, caring individuals interested in serving the public. They have to think fast on their feet and work well together as a team."

For Berkey, children are one of her main priorities. "My greatest joy has been helping to 'turn children onto reading.' I find that I am serving the children of parents whom I served when they were children. Seeing the love of reading passed on to another generation is very rewarding. One of my most enjoyable conversations recently was with a young boy who was researching how early roller skates evolved into the roller blades of today. Young readers have such diverse interests and it is fun to help them explore the library."

For the new director, library science was a calling. Berkey has been a library user since early childhood. When she graduated from Highland High School she worked as a summer school librarian. With her career goal firmly fixed, Berkey next earned her Bachelor of Arts degree at Purdue University before heading to Brigham Young University where she received her Master of Library Science while cataloging historic manuscripts and photographs.

"As a long time resident of Lowell, I have been a volunteer through Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, 4-H and the local schools. I know the people of the community and am eager to serve as their library director."
