The regular meeting of the Lowell Public Library Board of Trustees will be held.


### Blood Pressure/Glucose Testing

Saturday, July 29, 9 AM-4:30 PM.



### Free Music Downloads with Freegal

Thousands of artists, tens of thousands of albums, and hundreds of thousands of songs are available to registered cardholders of the Lowell Public Library and its Shelby and Schneider branches.

Through Freegal, a downloadable music service, library patrons can access the Sony Music Entertainment Catalog, that offers over one hundred genres of music without having to download special software or dealing with any digital rights management (DRM) issues. The content is based upon a license with Sony Music Entertainment, owner of fifty-four different music labels.

To access *Freegal*, pick up an application form at the library and turn it in at the circulation desk or download one from the library's website. Look for the *MUSIC* link on the left side of the page. An email message will be sent your address within 24 hours of being registered. You can download up to five songs per week!



Did you know that the library offers the Mango Languages online language-learning system to its patrons?

Mango is free for all library patrons and can be accessed anywhere with an Internet connection. Each lesson combines real life situations and audio from native speakers with simple, clear instructions. The courses are presented with an appreciation for cultural nuance and real-world application by focusing on the four key elements of language learning: vocabulary, pronunciation, grammar, and culture.

Mango offers access to 60 foreign language courses and 17 English courses taught completely in the user's native language. In addition to traditional language courses, Mango also offers the opportunity to learn through foreign film with Mango Premiere<sup>TM</sup> and access to a variety of specialty mini courses, like Pirate, Medical Spanish and romance courses. Mango can be accessed at the library, remotely, or even on-the-go with apps for iPhone<sup>®</sup>, Android<sup>TM</sup>, Kindle<sup>®</sup> and Nook<sup>®!</sup>
