HISTORIC HOMES OF LOWELL

The homes of a community have a story to tell, but too often that story is lost because it is not recorded. Today, more than ever before, there is interest in learning about and preserving the history of our communities and their buildings, and in authentically restoring those buildings.

In response to that interest, the first in a series of two programs on the Historic Homes of Lowell will be held at the Lowell Public Library on Thursday, July 6, at 7 p.m. Everyone who is interested in older homes (built prior to 1910), who currently lives in or has ever considered buying an older home, or who is simply interested in the history of the area, is invited to the program.

Anyone who has photographs or information about the historic homes in Lowell is requested to bring them to the library for duplication to add to the library's local history files for use by future generations of researchers. If possible, items should be brought to the library several days before the program, but materials will also be accepted at the program with the originals returned to the owners at a later date. In addition to photographs, deeds, surveys, contracts, or any other written information concerning the original or later owners of the home, the builder, details about construction and remodeling, are needed.

This program is a part of an Indiana
Heritage Research Grant awarded to the
library through a joint effort of the Indiana
Humanities Council and the Indiana
Historical Society.




