Reptiles to Take Center Stage



How many children does it take to hold a 13 1/2ft. python? Come to the fascinating reptile show at the Lowell Public Library on Tuesday, August 4, at 11 AM and do the counting. At Dave DiNaso's Traveling World of Reptiles show, meet Chiquita, a Burmese python that weighs over 115 pounds and is sure to thrill the crowd. Touch her! She loves being part of the show that includes Webster, the tarantula; Norris, the Nile crocodile; Kilo, a huge African bullfrog; Campbell, the snapping turtle and many of the other friends of Dave's in the reptile and amphibian world.

Part educational, Dave's program is loaded with laughs and inter-active moments with his audience. The event is open to both children and adults, and is the Grand Finale of the "Travel the Open Book Road" Summer Reading Club Program.

World War II Remembered at Library Program

Military service veterans, history buffs, students and the general public are invited to hear the stories of Nathan Long, a WWII reenactor and history researcher. He will share stories about the men he portrays at the Lowell Public Library on Wednesday, August 12, at 7 PM.

A reenactor for eight years, Long's interest in this period in our nation's history has given him unique experiences. He was interviewed for the documentary "Hero Ships" on the History Channel. One of the landing ship tanks (IST-325) is now in Evansville. These ships landed troops in Africa, Normandy, and Italy. When the U505 submarine was restored at the Museum of Science and Industry, Long was an extra in the movie that was made to show to visitors to the sub. In uniform and bringing original gear he has collected, Long will share a wealth of knowledge that will be of interest to young and old. The program is free and co-sponsored by the Three Creeks Historical Association and the library.

Learn all about composting from Master Gardener Larry Anderson. He will be taking your questions and sharing some hints to make gardening easier.




Library Board to Meet

Fun Facts about Reptiles

There are more than 8,000 species of reptiles on the planet, and they live on every continent except Antarctica (where it is too cold).

Reptiles are among the longest-lived species on the planet. For example, large tortoises such as the Aldabra Tortoise can live for more than 150 years. Alligators can live nearly 70 years. Ball pythons, a popular type of pet snake, can live up to 40 years. (Consider that before getting one as a pet.)

Contrary to popular belief, chameleons do not change their color to blend in with different back-grounds. Chameleons are naturally camouflaged with their surroundings (most are predominantly green to match their treetop environment). The fact is that chameleons change their color in limited ways, usually by brightening or darkening their skin. But these color changes are related to temperature regulation and emotional changes. A frightened or angry chameleon, for example, will become extremely bright in color.
