

OverDrive

Did you know that you can download free eBooks and Audiobooks from the library's website? After logging in with your library card and pin number, you can browse the collection and download to PC. Mac, and many mobile devices.

This service, powered by OverDrive, is provided free by the library to patrons in the Lowell Public Library district.

To get started, and you will need to install free software. For audiobooks, OverDrive® Media Console™; to read eBooks, you'll need Adobe® Digital Editions. To transfer books to other devices, you need to register for an Adobe ID. Downloaded books can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices, including NOOK, Sony Reader, iPod, and many others!

Free blood pressure and glucose screenings are offered by Clinical Management Services of Demotte.


Poetry Group


Craft Corner
