Every Whovian has their doctor. Whether you like the fourth doctor with the iconic striped scarf played by Tom Baker, or the twelfth doctor played by Peter Capaldi, there is a graphic novel based on these characters that you will want to read. Each graphic novel has different writers and artists.

So, get in your Tardis and come to the library to check out your preferred Doctor Who graphic novel. Just be careful of the Daleks.

FREE Diabetes Classes

If you have diabetes or pre-diabetes, it is important to learn more about controlling or preventing it. Learn more about symptoms and risk factors, managing what you eat, living a more active life, and preventing complications of the disease.

These classes are presented by Qsource, a nonprofit, healthcare quality improvement and information technology consultancy. (Qsource is paid by Medicare, and they never charge patients or participants for any of their programs.)

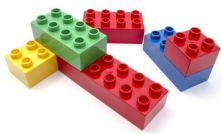

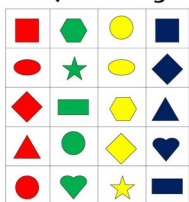

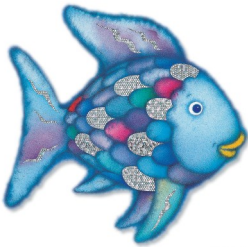

The Shelby Branch of the Lowell Public Library, next door to the post office, opened its doors on April 1, 1996. The library had been previously located at St. Theresa's Church in Shelby since July 1988.

The Schneider Branch officially opened on February 1, 1988, and is located in the Schneider Community Center.

Both branches provide their communities with access to books and magazines, movies, and internet computers, as well as year-round programming for children, young adults, and adults. A fax machine and copier are available for public use at each branch.

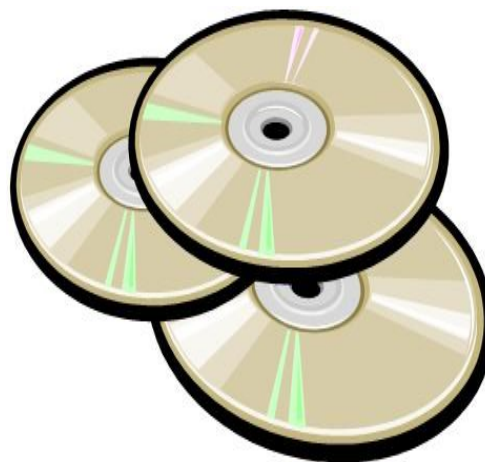
