HISTORIC HOMES PROJECT CONTINUES

The library's "Historic Homes of Lowell" project is off to a great start! On July 6, over 65 people attended the first in a series of two programs, to learn more about the research project and the history of some of the community's older houses.

Slides of the homes were presented by project photographer Don Cade, with commentary by Town Historian Richard Schmal, project researcher Jo Cade, and members of the audience. Additional remarks were made by Karen Kiemnec of the Historic Landmarks Foundation of Indiana.

With information provided by members of the community, Richard Schmal, and Jo Cade, the library hopes to expand its files on Lowell's historic homes. Twenty-four of those homes have now been selected to be included in a brochure and photo exhibit at the end of the project period in the spring. Informal photographs of the houses with their addresses will be on display in the library. Members of the community are encouraged to search their files for information on those or any other homes built before 1910 and bring that information to the library for reproduction.

Homes were selected for inclusion in the brochure based on age (built before 1910), condition, unique features, style, and location.

In the months to come, the team will be in touch with the owners and occupants of the homes to take additional pictures and find out more information about the houses.

As an Indiana Heritage Research Grant, this is a joint project of the Indiana Humanities Council and the Indiana Historical Society.

ENDOWMENT FUND NEARS GOAL

The Lowell Public Library Endowment Board is within reach of the \$25,000 goal of the first phase of their fund-raiser. To date, almost \$23,000 has been raised with \$15,000 in cash and pledges received during the last month.

In the July issue, Library Lines listed the names of businesses and local residents who supported the Endowment Fund during the first period of its existence. Recently the Times and an anonymous donor also pledged their support to the Fund.

The Endowment Board is a volunteer organization charged with fundraising for the library's newly established Endowment Fund. The purpose of the fund is to provide for library needs beyond what can be provided through the library's budget, making the difference between adequate and excellent library service for the people of the Three Creeks area. Donations to the fund are kept in trust; only the interest will be spent to help the library.

Once the first phase goal is achieved, the Endowment Board will begin the second phase of the fundraising drive to raise another \$25,000 between 1995 and 1999.

Gifts to the Endowment Fund can take the form of a cash donation, a pledge, a trust, or a life insurance policy naming the Fund. Contributions are tax deductible.






