There was more than reading books for the over 600 members of this year's "All Aboard the Reading Railroad" Summer Reading Club Program at the Lowell Public Library and its Shelby and Schneider branches. There was friendship too! For library staff, interacting with the young club members, helping to make the children feel at home in the library and encouraging their reading efforts, it was truly a pleasure.

At the end of the two-month long program club members had read a total of 25,245 books. Children recorded the titles of the books they read during the program and received a booklet of their reading accomplishments on the last day of the program.

During the long reading program, club members at the Lowell Public Library enjoyed the exciting performance of the parade horses of the Quirarte family of Mi Ranchito Restaurant. Dr. Herbert Hardwick of the Hebron Animal Hospital brought his wild animal family to the Shelby and Schneider Branches. The Horgash Pupeeteers were a hit with the crowd! Club members enjoyed other activities too: walking the Book Walk to receive a book to put in their home library, playing Railroad Bingo, and creating personal "Reading Railroad" trains.

The "Grand Finale" Carnival was a lively event with club members racing from game to game, playing the bingo toss, the candy walk, the bean bag toss, Bozo buckets and the rubber tip dart game. Library staff members Mary Braun and Rachel Engels put their artistic talents to work at the face painting booth, drawing butterflies and other whimsical designs on the faces of club members.
