"Quilt Sensations" 4th Biennial Library Quilter's Show

The Library Quilters will enhance the natural beauty of the library grounds with splashes of color created by the sensational quilts they will exhibit for their 4th Biennial Quilt Show on Saturday, September 18, from 9 AM to 2 PM.

Begun in 1989 by Schneider resident Mary K Bruce, the Library Quilters meet each week at the library to create quilted art in the form of quilts, pillows, wall hangings and other quilting projects. Quilters bring their projects and help other beginning quilters enhance their skills.

The natural setting of the library woods provides the perfect backdrop for the quilters. Wildflowers are in bloom and the new trees planted last year add to the beauty of the library setting.

Quilting demonstrations will take place in the library meeting room which will be used for the Quilt Show in the event of rain.

More color will be added to the Quilt Show as Friends of the Library are sponsoring a plant sale on the library lawn. The plants are part of a Friends fundraiser co-sponsored by Gardens of the Prairie.

At the Quilt Show the Friends of the Library will also offer Library Arbor T-shirts for sale (sizes L & XL) for \$8.

So Many Fish, So Many Books!

Members of the "Get Hooked on a Great Book" Summer Reading Club Program became avid fishermen during the two-month long program. The Green Pond Readers were children who read or listened to J++ (picture books) and E (easy readers) and earned a large "fish" for every 10 books they read. Blue Pond readers were children who read from the J fiction and nonfiction areas (chapter books) and earned a small "fish" for every chapter they read.

During the two-month program the young readers enjoyed the Kickoff Cookout, the Annual Great Pet Show, "fishy crafts," the Book Walk (each child won a book), learned to create an aquarium and celebrated with a Grand Finale Carnival. "Kidz In Tune," a pre-school music program presented by Kathy Birk was an exciting addition to the club schedule. The Shelby and Schneider Branch Library club members also enjoyed special Reading Club programs. Weekly drawings were held and prizes were awarded to children who read 100 books or 100 chapters. A drawing for Grand Prizes was held at each library. Fishing poles and tackle boxes were presented to the winners.

Children's Librarian Barbara Berkey reported that "over 500 children registered for the Summer Reading Club Program. In Lowell alone, Green Pond Readers read 9,775 books and Blue Pond Readers read 13,123 chapters (1,334 books.)"

The Summer Reading Club was funded by the Friends of the Library.

YA's Score Big in Reading Contest!

Young Adults took to the YA Reading Contest by reading over 990 books over the two-month long contest. Approximately 174 young adults, grades 4 through 12th participated in the contest and the YA programs that were held during the summer vacation. Weekly drawing for prizes donated by local businesses and the Friends of the Library enhanced the contest.

"Among the YA programming highlights of the summer included: the Kick-Off Cook-Out, a sign language course, a yoga class, a Red Cross babysitting course, one-stroke painting classes, movies and book discussions." stated YA Coordinator Debbie Blink.

With donations from the community, the YALAB (Young Adult Library Advisory Board) set up and manned the "Back to School" Rummage Sale in August. The three-day sale netted the YA board members over \$1300 to donate to the Friends of the Library to fund young adult library programs in 2005. The YA board and the library appreciates the many residents and businesses that contributed to the rummage sale.

SAT Prep Course Offered

A six-week course to prepare high school students for taking both the verbal and math sections of the S.A.T. will be held at the library each Tuesday, from 5 PM to 6 PM beginning September 14.

The course, taught by SAT instructor Gloria Vela, will introduce students to effective test taking and time management strategies. She will review vocabulary words used in the verbal section of the SAT which tests students' abilities to understand and analyze what they read, recognize relationships between parts of a sentence, and determine relationships between two words. Also, Vela will review math concepts and traps, in addition to focusing on the math formulas students need to know before taking the SAT. Get your questions answered about what the test is now and will be in 2005.

Fee for the course instruction is \$100. The book for the course, *The New SAT*, is \$32 and can be ordered through the library. A deposit of \$50 is due upon registration to cover the cost of the book order and a portion of the fee. The balance is due no later than Monday, September 14. 
