# Summer Reading Success!

As summer wound down, summer reading program numbers were totaled, showing showed that 492 children at the Lowell Library and its Shelby and Schneider branches were registered this year. Books read total 17,835; chapters totaled 19,419. There were a total of 3,709 rewards given! Not only were books read, but there were crafts and games throughout the summer; AND the finale, Dave DiNaso's Traveling World of Reptiles.

Kids' Nature Club at the branches was also very successful! Children enjoyed bug pinning, a night walk, and two visits from the Environobile!

The young adults had a great summer too! There were a total of 447 weekly drawing entries, as well as 135 entries (three books read equaled one entry ticket) for the grand prize, a Kindle Fire eReader. The winner was sixth grader Michael Cullins!

Adults had a summer reading contest too! There were 837 entries (one for each book read). The winner drawn was Peg Atherton, who won a \$100 Strack and Van Til gift card!



This new service, powered by OverDrive, is provided free by the library to patrons in the Lowell Public Library district. To get started, you will need to install free software; for Audiobooks: OverDrive® Media Console™. To read eBooks, you'll need Adobe® Digital Editions. To transfer books to other devices you need to register for an Adobe ID. Downloaded books can be enjoyed immediately or transferred to a variety of devices, including the NOOK, Sony Reader, iPod, and many others!
