Summer Reading Successes

At the end of the eight week *Explore New Worlds READ!*Summer Reading Club program, the numbers were tallied and showed that 638 children at the Lowell library and its Shelby and Schneider branches read 27,490 books and 35,585 chapters. Of course, it wasn't all reading. The children had a lot of fun with trips to the treasure box and attending the weekly craft programs, the minicarnival and the reptile show!

Young Adults had an equally impressive participation - 35 readers of 337 books! The top winners of gift cards were: Peter Kotlin(\$50), Jaxson Peak (\$40), Hudson Van Deursen (\$30), and Hannah Frump (\$20).

Our adult patrons entered the name of each book they read. There were 603 entry slips. Geri Richlik and Helen Joseph each won a Kindle Fire tablet, while Sandra Adams and Ginger Anderson each won a set of 4 Brookfield Zoo tickets. Congratulations to all of our prize winners and all of our summer readers!

Wowbrary is a free service that provides you with weekly emails and about the library's most recent acquisitions of new books, DVDs, and CDs.



What is hoopla? Hoopla is a free digital media service that allows you to borrow movies, music, audiobooks, ebooks, comics, magazines, and TV shows to enjoy on your computer, tablet, or phone — even your TV! With no waiting, titles can be streamed immediately or downloaded to phones or tablets for offline enjoyment later.

There are hundreds of thousands of titles to choose from with more being added daily. *Hoopla* is like having your public library at your fingertips – anytime, anywhere.

Freegal® Music is a FREE music service from the library. Freegal offers download or streaming access to more than 8 million songs, including Sony Music's catalog of legendary artists. In total the collection is comprised of music from over 28,000 labels with music that originates in over 80 countries. There is no software to download, and there are no digital rights management (DRM) restrictions. To access *Freegal*, pick up an application form at the library and turn it in at the circulation desk (or download one from the library's website). An email message will be sent your address within 24 hours of being registered. You can download up to five songs per week!
