On the library site, landscapers are preparing the grounds for sod and the planting of several shrubs and bushes that will enhance the beautiful wooded surroundings.

Library staff are anxious to settle in and prepare for opening day, tentatively set for mid-October. Watch the newspaper for exact dates.


## A BRIGHT FUTURE FOR LITERACY

The future of the Lowell Public Library Literacy Program is looking bright as the program receives \$34,939.00 funding through the Federal Library Services and Construction Act Title VI grant with in-house matching funds in the amount of \$16,132.00 for the up-coming year. Wonderful new additions can be expected as the program expands to address the needs of family literacy and basic computer skills.

New to the program will be a year-round family literacy program beginning with a pilot program, working with the parents of Head Start children, ages 3-4. In late September, parents of Head Start children will take part in a three-part parenting program entitled, Parents: The Child's First Teacher" offered at the South County Community Services Center. With the assistance of tutors, coordinators, and teachers, parents will take an active role in creating a love of reading through play, story telling, and by demonstrating good reading behaviors. In January, the library will be offering this program to parents with children enrolled in storytime.

Monies provided through this grant will allow for the purchase of additional resources for both student and tutor. New computers will be added to study areas, equipped with learning software for reading, phonics, and computer education. Additional training in basic computer skills will also become a part of the program. Our ever-successful migrant and ESL programs will receive additional bilingual materials to expand the collection begun in the previous year.

With this new funding help, the future holds great hope for new programs and the continued success of our existing programs in adult literacy tutoring.

The Lowell Labor Day Parade is the oldest parade in the state of Indiana? ### LABOR DAY CLOSING


