The puzzle! If the 849 young club members of the "Under the Big Top" Summer Reading Club Program at the library and its Shelby and Schneider Branches, read a total of 43,818 books during the two-month-long program, how much money was saved using the library?


At an average of \$15.42 * per title, if children had bought the books they read, they would have spent \$675,673.56.

And...if all the books read were laid end to end, it would make a row almost 6 miles long.

And...that's what they did this summer!!!
