DRAWING\CARTOONING COURSES WITH ARTIST NIKKI KUTANSKY

The Lowell Public Library and the Lowell Parks Department are co-sponsoring a series of drawing courses at the library by Munster artist and instructor Nikki Kutansky. This is the 8th year that these courses are being offered in Lowell and the 3rd year for the new library. These classes are identical to those Mr. Kutansky has been teaching for 12 years at the Center For Visual and Performing Arts in Munster, but are offered to residents of Lowell and the surrounding area at greatly reduced costs. Significant results can be anticipated, whether a beginning or returning student. This does not duplicate regular school curriculum; it significantly augments it.

The 10-week courses are open to persons ages 9 to adult.


