# **Exhibit Highlights Astronaut's Visit**

The dramatic exhibit in the library's large display case represents the six space shuttle flights astronaut Col. Jerry Ross has flown to date. Most recently Col. Ross served as mission specialist aboard the space shuttle Endeavor where he completed six space walks for the historic project

that began the assembly of the international space station Unity.

The major portion of the exhibit was given to the library by NASA and includes a large photograph of the December 4, 1998, lift-off of the shuttle Endeavor, a photograph of the Endeavor, a smaller picture of the crew personally autographed by each astronaut of this historic mission and a photograph of Col. Ross.

The exhibit is in conjunction with the visit to Lowell by Col. Ross, who will be honored as Grand Marshall of the Lowell Labor Day Parade on Monday, September 6. The parade will begin on Commercial Avenue at 10 AM. He will also present a video narrative of the Endeavor flight for the general public at the Lowell High School on Saturday, September 4, at 2 PM.

Crowe has been the subject of many articles in newspapers such as the *Chicago Tribune* and the *Sun-Times*. He has appeared on *Oprah*, *CNN*, *Unsolved Mysteries*, and *Hard Copy*. 
Members of the YA contest read a total of 2,165 books. The grand prize winner of a \$100 gift certificate was Erik The results of the YA mystery be announced on Friday,
