ld About Reading 2023!

Summer Reading kicks off on Monday, June 5, registration begins on Tuesday, May 30. This year you will create a monkey as you read! The eight week summer reading program is designed to encourage reading and to avoid the "summer slide".

Earn a trip to the treasure box each time you check out five books or more! For every 10 books/chapters you read, earn a ticket and items to add to your monkey. Don't forget to save up these tickets to shop in the prize room in August!

And, each time you log in your books, you can fill out a drawing slip to be eligible for a weekly book drawing.

In addition to reading we are also offering various program activities on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Sign-ups will be available one week prior to each program, either online or by calling the library.

The following programs are for children from birth to those who have just completed the fourth grade. There are two sessions for each summer activity - 10:30 AM and 1:30 PM. To assure that we have enough supplies, children must be pre-registered, and children preschool age and under must be accompanied by an adult. Registration for these activities begin on Tuesday, May 30.
