The large yellow sign located at the entrance to the library is posted to let young people of the community know that the library is a designated "Safe Place" and has been since 1994. Public institutions and businesses assist the Safe Place project in reaching out to young people who are seeking help from conflict in their home. The program offers easy access to services such as Alternative House, which provides shelter and counseling aimed at resolving family problems.

Safe Place is under the auspices of the Crisis Center, which is funded in part by the Indiana Department of Child Services, the Indiana Department of Education and the Lake County Division of Child Services.

#### Abe, Mary & Robert Todd: The Lincoln Family Legacy

While much is written about the enormous impact of Abraham Lincoln on the history of Illinois, the contributions of his wife and oldest son are sometimes overlooked. In this program, we explore the Lincoln Family Legacy in the state, from Abe's arrival as a young man in 1830 to Robert Todd's departure for Vermont and Washington DC in 1911.



Abraham Lincoln came to Illinois at 21 to assist his father and step-mother in their relocation to Coles County near Decatur. He then set about becoming the prototype of the self-made man, learning the skills of oratory and debate, teaching himself the skills of surveying, and studying law books to pursue a legal career. During 30 years in politics he lost in a popular vote only once and was instrumental in forming the Republican Party in Illinois.

Mary Todd Lincoln was an educated young lady from a well-to-do family, and as the Lincoln family grew she managed their home and engaged in spirited conversations with her husband. Mr. Lincoln relied on her intellect and knowledge as he formed his political policy positions.

Robert Todd Lincoln was the oldest of the Lincoln children, and the only one to live a full, long life. After attending Harvard and joining the Army in the final year of the Civil War, Robert moved to Chicago with his mother and completed his education. He went into law practice in the city, and then went on to be a legal counsel and later President of the Pullman Company. In *Abe, Mary, and Robert Todd*, we will see that there is more than one important person sharing this famous surname.

#### AARP Tax Aide

Free tax preparation, for low-income (up to 40,000), disabled or retired individuals will be offered by AARP volunteers beginning on Monday, February 1. You MUST be a resident of the Tri-Creek area (Cedar, Eagle or West Creek) to register. Tax appointments will be <u>curbside drop-off/pick-up only</u>. NO tax appointments will be held inside the library. <u>Please stay in your car and an AARP volunteer will come out to you.</u>
Appointment slots will fill up fast- call now!

#### Tax Forms

Free Federal tax forms are located opposite the public copier in the reference area. Please take only one of each form you need. You can make copies if you need more than one copy of any form.

Unfortunately, Indiana forms are not being printed this year, they are only available online. Ask at the reference desk and we can print out the forms you need at  $10 \ensuremath{\varphi}$  cost per page. Since we are often working on several requests at once, please leave us a list of what you need and we will call you when your order is ready to be picked up.

#### COVID-19: What We Are Doing to Keep You Safe

- Curbside service is still available by request.
- Beginning February 1, we will no longer have time restrictions (except for public computer use).
- Newspapers can be read daily. Magazines can be read in the library or checked out.
- Masks are required and all social distancing guidelines must be followed.
- "Stand Here" X's have been placed throughout the library and plastic shields have been installed at our reference and circulation desks.
- Tutoring/small group space is not available.
- Print/Copy/Scan/Fax services is available, however due to social distancing guidelines, they are self-service only. Printing/Copying is limited to 50 pages per day.
- Computer usage is limited to 1/2 hour per day and machines are sanitized between use. Staff cannot provide "over the shoulder" assistance as we will be maintaining recommended distancing. Please bring someone with you if you think you will need technical help.
- All materials must be returned to the OUTSIDE book drop only. Items are quarantined before being put back into circulation.
- Because of limited staff, it is not possible to ensure that bathrooms and other common surface areas are sanitized at all times; please act accordingly.
- All programs for children, teens, and adults will continue to be enjoyed virtually. Subscribe to our YouTube channel. Crafts, cooking, history programs, and story time are among some of the topics you can explore and learn from!
- Study and meeting rooms and some furniture will not be available to reduce the spread of COVID-19. Remaining furniture has been rearranged to promote social distancing.

#### Changes to DVD Policy for 2021

Beginning February 1, you will be allowed to place holds on DVDs (except new releases). In addition, we have expanded the amount of DVDs you can check out at one time AND the length of time you may borrow them for.

New Feature Films - 4 at a time for 3 days

TV Series and Older Films - 8 at a time for 7 days (plus 1 auto-renewal).

Non - Fiction - 4 at a time for 14 days (plus 1 auto-renewal).

That's a total of 16 DVDs you can take out with one trip to the library!

Renewals are automatic UNLESS someone has placed a hold on them. It is your responsibility to check on your own record.

#### We Are Always Open!

Did you know that you can access much of the library, even if the building is closed? Whether in your car in the parking lot or sitting at a table or on one of our benches outside, you can access our public Wi-Fi, and its FREE!

With your library card or an e-Card, you can download books, audio books, magazines and music through *Overdrive*, *HOOPLA* and *FREEGAL*. Streaming movies are available through *HOOPLA*. You can apply for an e-Card at our website by clicking on *Get A Library Card*.


