Summer Reading: Having a Blast! June 7 - July 31

Hello Summer Readers!

Our Summer Reading is going to be different again this year. We sure would love to offer a BIG Summer Reading Program, but unfortunately we are still unable to do so. In order to continue keeping everyone healthy and safe during this time, we will not be holding any crafts, large group activities or programs in the library. However, we are offering activities that you can enjoy at home, along with continuing to read lots of great books! This program is for children from birth to those entering the fifth grade.

We WILL have registration this summer. Registration starts the week of June 1-5 during our regular hours. Summer Reading officially starts June 7. When you check out 5 books or more, get a ticket for a prize from the treasure box!

We will get a booklet together for you when you register and your booklets will be kept behind the children's desk. Each time you come in to log the books you have read, ask in the children's department and we will hand you your booklet to log. We will keep your booklet until next time. For every 10 books/chapters logged, you will receive a ticket. You will continue to collect a ticket for each 10 books/chapters over the 8 weeks.

During the week of Monday August 2- Saturday August 7, you can come to the children's area and Miss Jackie or Miss Hayley will let you "shop" for books and prizes in the program room, using those tickets you have been collecting!

We will begin offering online activities (with take- home crafts) beginning Tuesday, June 8. On Tuesdays, Miss Jackie will craft with you virtually on You Tube.

On Thursdays, Miss Jackie will hold an in-person story time outdoors (weather permitting) or in the program room. You can also watch Miss Jackie's story time on You Tube. Please call ahead to sign up for in-person story times. Space is limited. Children preschool age and younger must be accompanied by an adult.



COVID-19: What We Are Doing to Keep You Safe

- Masks are recommended and all social distancing guidelines must be followed.
- We no longer have time restrictions.
- Newspapers can be read daily. Magazines can be read in the library or checked out.
- "Stand Here" X's have been placed throughout the library and plastic shields have been installed at our reference and circulation desks.
- Tutoring/small group space is not available.
- Study rooms for individual use are available.
- Print/Copy/Scan/Fax services is available, however due to social distancing guidelines, they are self-service only. Printing/Copying is limited to 50 pages per day.
- No time limit for computer use (unless others are waiting). Machines are sanitized between use. Staff cannot provide "over the shoulder" assistance as we will be maintaining recommended distancing. Please bring someone with you if you think you will need technical help.
- Materials may be returned either to the INDOOR or OUTDOOR book drop. All items are quarantined before being put back into circulation.
- Because of limited staff, it is not possible to ensure that bathrooms and other common surface areas are sanitized at all times; please act accordingly.
- Programs for children, teens, and adults can be enjoyed virtually in addition to some in-person programs being added. Subscribe to our YouTube channel. Crafts, cooking, history programs, and story time are among some of the topics you can explore and learn from!
- Meeting Room reservations are being taken (with capacity and use limits.) Tables have been rearranged to promote social distancing.

In response to current COVID conditions and in order to keep our patrons and staff safe, it is recommended that you wear a mask over your nose and mouth while you are in the library. If you prefer, we will gladly set you up to use our Curbside Service - we bring items out to you!



- Categories include: Landscape, Architecture, Automotive/ Machinery, Animals & the Lowell Library Nature Trail
- Each category is limited to the first 25 submissions
- Four divisions include: grade school, middle school, high school & adult
- Divisions are separated by the current age of participant.
- Color and black & white photographs will be judged together in each category
- Family Friendly subject matter only
- Photos must have been taken within the last 2 years
- Only 8 ½" x 11" sized photographs allowed
- Entries must be submitted inside clear plastic page protectors
- Participant information labels are given at the time entries are turned in. Labels must be affixed on the back side of the page protector
- The Friends of the Library reserve the right to refuse submissions that do not follow the rules & are not responsible for any lost or damaged entries
- Pictures may be taken of entries and participants and used for publicity purposes.
- The Friends of the Library reserve the right to use or discard entries not picked up by the designated time. Photos relinquished in this manner may be used for promotional or fundraising purposes by the Friends or the library.
